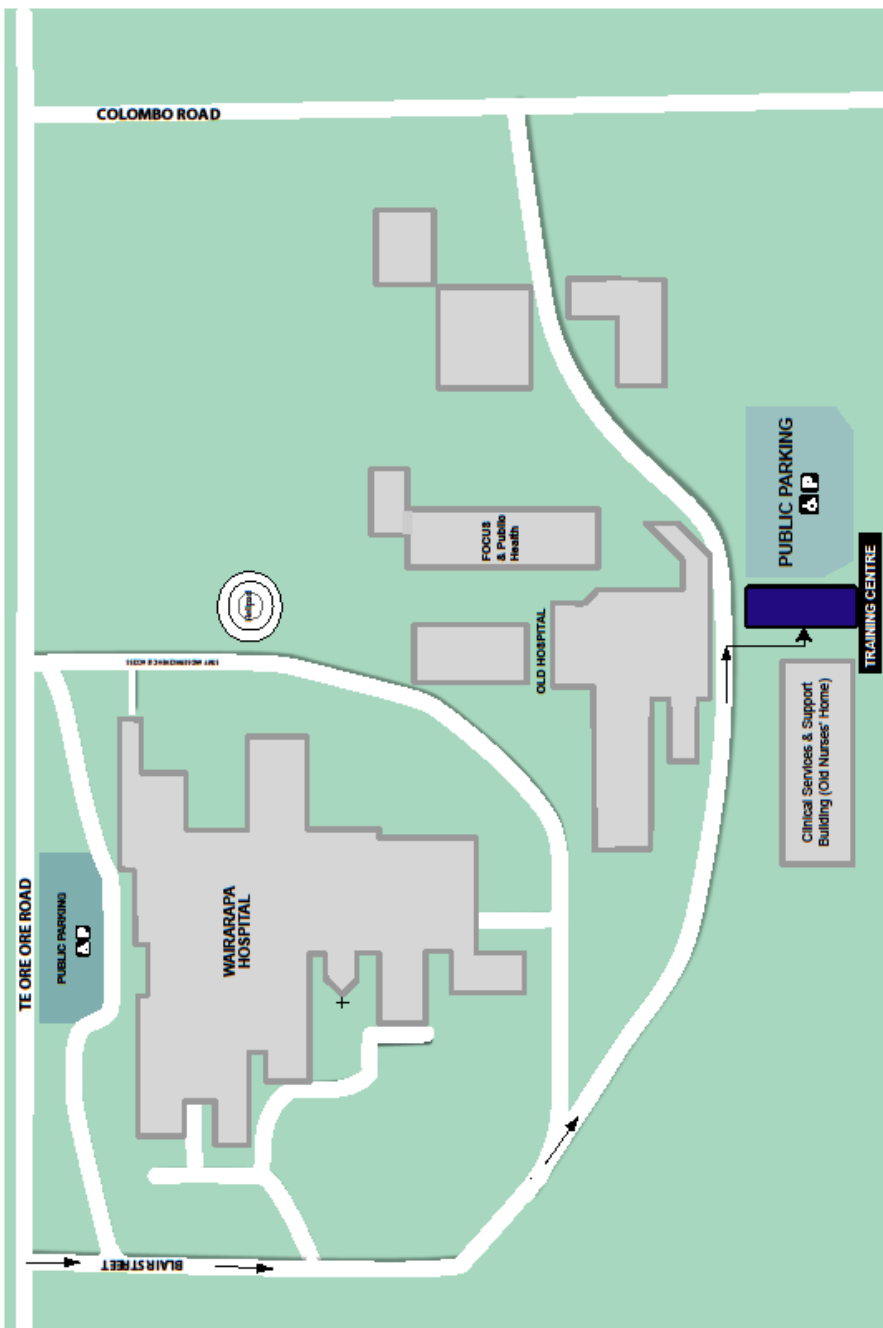

Scenarios: Adult and child/infant collapse, Medical and Trauma

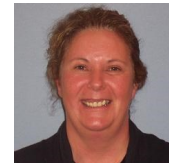
All staff attending this day will also have skill station assessments and will sit an Exam. Reading the NZRC book is essential to the successful completion of this course.

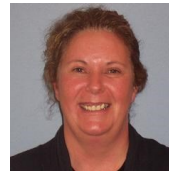

Breastfeeding & Safe Baby Training

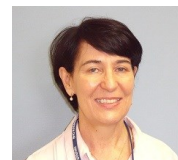

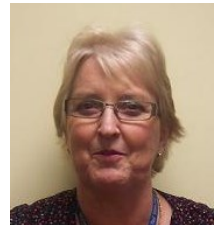

Patient Journey through Surgery: A Focus on Anaesthesia

Do you want to know more about what happens to your patient during surgery? Nearly all the patients that you care for have undergone anaesthesia at some time during their lives.
