The vaccines will be offered in stages, and the first protection is being offered to those people who are at direct risk of getting Covid-19. Priority groups and our most vulnerable will be vaccinated, there will be enough vaccines for everyone, and we will be keeping you informed.

Right now, New Zealand needs you to:

- stay home if you are sick
- call Healthline 0800358 5453 if you have symptoms
- record where you have been using the tracer app
- wash your hands well and often
- cough or sneeze into your elbow
- keep a safe distance from people you don't know

All trusted communications about Covid-19 and the vaccine will come to you from the Ministry of Health, Covid-19.govt.nz and your health professionals.

Misinformation, scams and frauds exploiting COVID-19 may arrive in the form of an email, text, phone call or through social media. Here's how you can keep yourself safe:

- All Covid related testing, vaccinations and care is FREE. You are right to suspect any activity that seeks payment, or any personal information request that does not come directly from a trusted health professional
- Don't click links or press any voting button if you suspect it might be fraudulent
- Note down the number they called you from, if you can
- If you've provided your banking details or installed any software, contact your bank immediately
- Remember - any communications about Covid-19 and the vaccine will come only from the Ministry of Health or other trusted sources. Check the Covid19 or Ministry websites to be sure: www.health.govt.nz or www.covid19.govt.nz
